6th Workshop on Ichnotaxonomy

The 6th Workshop on Ichnotaxonomy will take place in the 'Cradle of Neoichnology' – at the SENCKENBERG am Meer research institute in Wilhelmshaven, Germany, literally just few metres from the Wadden Sea of the North Sea. Furthering the long tradition of ichnological research at this site (Richter, Häntzschel, Schäfer, Reineck, Hertweck, ...), participants are invited to present their work on the ichnotaxonomy of trace fossils, with a focus on implications for ichnotaxonomical principles and nomenclature. We expect lively discussions, both at the round table and during two fieldtrips that will help fostering the value and applicability of trace fossil nomenclature and classification, as a basis for interpreting palaeoenvironments and for studies of palaeobiology and evolution. The workshop is foremost directed towards experienced ichnotaxonomists with an interest in being involved in discussion and re-evaluation of ichnotaxonomical problems in general and the validity and applicability of ichnotaxobases in particular.
