

Research alumni and their Senckenberg partners have the opportunity to apply for various annual grants:

REUNION GRANT:

If you, as alumni, have conducted collaborative research at Senckenberg before and wish to continue your collaboration at Senckenberg, you can apply for funds to return to Senckenberg. TRAVEL GRANT FOR CO-SUPERVISORS:

If you, as an alumnus/a, are co-supervising a PhD thesis of a Senckenberg doctoral student, you can apply for a travel grant to come to Germany for the thesis defense or another meeting with the PhD student and his/her Senckenberg advisor.

TRAVEL GRANTS FOR YOUNG SCIENTISTS:

If you are a PhD student or a junior researcher in a group led by a Senckenberg scientists or his/her international collaboration partner, you can apply for a travel grant to visit the partner's lab.
